Statement of the Inner Mongolian People's Party

Inner Mongolia People's Party

The Inner Mongolian People's Party held a congress from June 29 to 30, 2015, in Stockholm, the capital of Sweden. This was the first major meeting following the special session held in Tokyo in 2006. Representatives from various branches of the Inner Mongolian People's Party attended the congress. Supporters of the Southern Mongolian resistance movement and observers from human rights organizations were also present.

The congress amended the party's guiding principle and once again emphasized that the ultimate goal of the Inner Mongolian People's Party is to put an end to Chinese colonial rule in Southern Mongolia and ultimately achieve Southern Mongolian self-determination and independence. The congress discussed and determined the party's working guidelines, clarifying that all work will be carried out in accordance with democratic principles. At the same time, appropriate adjustments were made to the organizational structure of the Inner Mongolian People's Party.

During the congress, the participating representatives engaged in broad discussions and analyses on the current political, economic, and social conditions of Southern Mongolia, and outlined specific work to be carried out both within and outside the region in the coming period.

The congress elected new members of the Executive Committee, including a president and a secretary-general. H. Dolgion (Dolgion Khatgin), formerly an Executive Committee member of the Inner Mongolian People's Party, was elected as the party's President. S. Bayar (S. Bayar) was elected as the Secretary-General.
